1-20 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-22 relating to instruction in positive character traits and personal 1-23 skills in public schools.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The heading to Section 29.906, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 29.906. CHARACTER TRAITS $\underline{\text{AND}}$ PERSONAL SKILLS INSTRUCTION.

SECTION 2. Sections 29.906(a), (b), and (c), Education Code, are amended to read as follows:

- (a) The State Board of Education shall integrate positive character traits <u>and personal skills</u> into the essential knowledge and skills adopted for kindergarten through grade 12, as appropriate.
- (b) The State Board of Education must include the following positive character traits <u>and personal skills</u>:
 - (1) courage;
- (2) trustworthiness, including honesty, reliability, punctuality, and loyalty;
 - (3) integrity;
 - (4) respect and courtesy;
- (5) responsibility, including accountability, diligence, perseverance, <u>self-management skills</u>, and self-control;
- (6) fairness, including justice and freedom from
- 1-45 prejudice;

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- 1-46 (7) caring, including kindness, empathy, compassion, 1-47 consideration, patience, generosity, [and] charity, and 1-48 interpersonal skills;
- 1-49 (8) good citizenship, including patriotism, concern 1-50 for the common good and the community, <u>responsible decision-making</u> 1-51 <u>skills</u>, and respect for authority and the law;
 - (9) school pride; and
 - (10) gratitude.
 - (c) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school must adopt a character education program that includes the positive character traits and personal skills listed in Subsection (b). In developing or selecting a character education program under this section, a school district shall consult with a committee selected by the district that consists of:
 - (1) parents of district students;
