## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the time for rendering a final order in certain suits 1-19 affecting the parent-child relationship involving the Department 1-20 of Family and Protective Services. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 1-21 1-22 1-23

SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 263, Family Code, is amended by adding Section 263.4011 to read as follows: 1-24

Sec. 263.4011. RENDERING FINAL ORDER; EXTENSION. 1-25 (a) On timely commencement of the trial on the merits under Section 263.401, the court shall render a final order not later than the 90th day after the date the trial commences. 1-26 1-27 1-28

(b) The 90-day period for rendering a final order under 1-29 Subsection (a) is not tolled for any recess during the trial. 1-30

(c) If the court finds that extraordinary circumstances necessitate extending the 90-day period under Subsection (a), the court may grant one extension of that date for not longer than 30 1-31 1-32 1-33 days. The court shall render a written order: 1-34

(1) specifying the grounds on which the extension is 1-35 1-36 granted; and

(2) requiring a final order to be rendered not later than the 30th day after the date the extension is granted. (d) A party may file a mandamus proceeding if the court 1-37 1-38

1-39 fails to render a final order within the time required by this 1-40 1-41 section.

SECTION 2. Section 263.4011, Family Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a suit affecting the parent-child relationship 1-42 1-43 1 - 44filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A suit affecting 1-45 the parent-child relationship filed before that date is governed by 1-46 the law in effect on the date the suit was filed, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021. 1-47
