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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-19 relating to formula funding for excess undergraduate credit hours 1-20 at public institutions of higher education and to the tuition rate 1-21 that may be charged for those credit hours.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 54.014, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to 1-24 1-25 read as follows:

1-26 (a) An institution of higher education may charge a resident 1-27 1-28 undergraduate student tuition at a higher rate than the rate charged to other resident undergraduate students, not to exceed the rate charged to nonresident undergraduate students, if before the 1-29 1-30 semester or other academic session begins the student has previously attempted a number of semester credit hours for courses 1-31 1-32 taken at any institution of higher education while classified as a 1-33 resident student for tuition purposes that exceeds [by at least 30 1-34 hours] the number of semester credit hours required for completion 1-35 of the degree program in which the student is enrolled by at least: 1-36

(1) for an associate degree program, 15 hours; or

(2) for a baccalaureate degree program, 30 hours. (a-1) For purposes of <u>Subsection (a)</u> [this subsection], an undergraduate student who is not enrolled in a degree program is 1-37 1-38 1-39 considered to be enrolled in a <u>baccalaureate</u> degree program [or 1-40 programs requiring a minimum of 120 semester credit hours, including minors and double majors, and for completion of any 1-41 1-42 1-43 certificate or other special program in which the student is also enrolled, including a program with a study-abroad component]. 1 - 44

(a-2) An institution of higher education that charges 1-45 students tuition at a higher rate under <u>Subsection (a)</u> [this subsection] may adopt a policy under which the institution exempts 1-46 1-47 1-48 from the payment of that higher rate a student that is subject to 1-49 the payment of the higher rate solely as a result of hardship as 1-50 determined by the institution under the policy.

SECTION 2. Sections 61.0595(a) and (b), Education Code, are 1-51 1-52 amended to read as follows:

1-53 In the formulas established under Section 61.059, the (a) 1-54 board may not include funding for semester credit hours earned by a 1-55 resident undergraduate student who before the semester or other academic session begins has previously attempted a number of semester credit hours for courses taken at any institution of higher education while classified as a resident student for tuition 1-56 1-57 1-58 1-59 purposes that exceeds [by at least 30 hours] the number of semester credit hours required for completion of the degree program or 1-60 1-61 programs in which the student is enrolled, including minors and

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double majors, and for completion of any certificate or other special program in which the student is also enrolled, including a 2-1 2-2 2-3 program with a study-abroad component, by at least: 2-4

(1) for an associate degree program, 15 hours; or (2) for a baccalaureate degree program, 30 hours. For purposes of Subsection (a), an undergraduate 2**-**5 2**-**6 (b) student who is not enrolled in a degree program is considered to be 2-7 2-8 enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program [requiring a minimum of 120 semester credit hours]. 2-9

2**-**10 2**-**11 SECTION 3. Section 54.014, Education Code, as amended by this Act, applies beginning with tuition charged for the 2023 fall 2-12 semester.

SECTION 4. Section 61.0595, Education Code, as amended by 2-13 2-14 this Act, applies beginning with funding recommendations made under 2**-**15 2**-**16 Section 61.059, Education Code, for the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023. 2-17

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
