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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-19 relating to a study on administrative penalties assessed against a 1-20 substance use disorder service provider and to requiring the Health and Human Services Commission to provide administrative penalty 1-21 1-22 1-23 schedules on the commission's Internet website.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. (a) In this Act:

"Commission" means the Health and Human Services 1-25 (1)1-26 Commission.
