A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-19 relating to minimum standards for prescribed burns. 1-20

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code, is 1-22 1-23 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 153.047. PRESCRIBED BURNING STANDARDS. Minimum 1-24 standards established by the board for prescribed burning must:

(1) ensure that prescribed burning is the controlled application of fire to naturally occurring or naturalized 1-25 1-26 vegetative fuels under specified environmental conditions in accordance with a written prescription plan: 1-27 1-28

1-29 (A) designed to confine the fire tο а 1-30 predetermined area and to accomplish planned land management 1-31 objectives; and

1-32 (B) that conforms to the standards established 1-33 under this section;

1-34 (2) if the prescription plan lists a certified and insured prescribed burn manager as the burn boss, require that the 1-35 burn boss be [at least one certified and insured prescribed burn 1-36 1-37 <u>is</u>] present on site during the conduct of the prescribed manager-1-38 burn;

1-39 (3) establish appropriate guidelines for size of 1-40 burning crews sufficient to:

1-41 (A) conduct the burn in accordance with the 1-42 prescription plan; and

1-43 (B) provide adequate protection for the safety of 1-44 persons and of adjacent property;

1-45 (4) include standards for notification to adjacent land owners, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, and 1-46 1-47 local fire authorities; and

1-48 (5) include minimum insurance requirements for 1-49 certified and insured prescribed burn managers.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023. 1-50

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
