BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 751.003, Government Code, is amended to 1-24 1-25 read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 751.003. SUNSET PROVISION. The Office of State-Federal Relations is subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, 1-27 1-28 the office is abolished [and this chapter expires] September 1, 1-29 1-30 <u>2035</u> [<del>2023</del>].
