relating to training requirements for staff members of certain 1-19 assisted living facilities that provide care to persons with 1-20 1-21 Alzheimer's disease and related disorders. 1-22

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 247, Health and Safety

1-24 Code, is amended by adding Section 247.0291 to read as follows: Sec. 247.0291. TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR STAFF MEMBERS 1-25 OF

ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES PROVIDING CARE TO RESIDENTS WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE OR RELATED DISORDERS.
