A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-17 relating to the issuance of state parklands passports to and a 1-18 waiver of certain state park fees for certain veterans, active duty 1-19 armed forces members, and certain family members of a person who 1-20 died while serving in the United States armed forces.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 13.018, Parks and Wildlife Code, is 1-23 amended by amending Subsections (a), (c), and (e) and adding 1-24 Subsection (f) to read as follows:

1-25 (a) The following people may apply to the department for a 1-26 state parklands passport:

1-27 (1) a resident of this state who is 65 years old or 1-28 over who has resided in the state for six consecutive months 1-29 preceding the date of application for a parklands passport[, a 1-30 member of the United States armed forces on active duty who is 65 1-31 years old or over,] or any other individual in a category that the 1-32 commission by rule designates as a resident of this state who is 65 1-33 years old or over;

1-34 (2) an honorably discharged [a] veteran of the United 1-35 <u>States</u> armed services [of the United States who, as a result of 1-36 military service, has a service-connected disability, as defined by 1-37 the Veterans' Administration, consisting of the loss of the use of a 1-38 lower extremity or of a 60 percent disability rating and who is 1-39 receiving compensation from the United States because of the 1-40 disability]; [and]

1-41 (3) <u>a member of the United States armed services on</u> 1-42 <u>active duty;</u> (4) <u>a curruining spouse</u>, parent, child, or si<u>bling of a</u>

1-43 (4) a surviving spouse, parent, child, or sibling of a 1-44 person who died while serving in the United States armed forces; and 1-45 (5) an individual who has a physical or mental 1-46 impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life 1-47 activities of the individual.

1-48 (c) The holder of a state parklands passport issued on or 1-49 before August 31, 1995, a person whose birth date is before 1-50 September 1, 1930, or a person [veteran] described by Subsection 1-51 (a)(2), (3), or (4) is entitled to enter any state park without 1-52 payment of an entrance or admission fee. When a fee is charged by 1-53 the department for entrance of a vehicle into a state park, the 1-54 vehicle of the holder of a state parklands passport is exempt from 1-55 the fee when the holder is present.

1-56 (e) <u>A state parklands passport issued to a person described</u> 1-57 <u>by Subsection (a)(3) is valid for one year from the date of issuance</u> 1-58 <u>and may be renewed in the manner prescribed by commission rule.</u>

1-59 (f) The commission by rule shall establish eligibility 1-60 requirements and privileges available to the holder of a state 1-61 parklands passport described by Subsection (a)(5) [(a)(3)]. H.B. No. 1740 2-1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
