A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the authority of the Texas Transportation Commission to 1-19 1-20 establish variable speed limits. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 545.353, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:

1-24 (k) The commission by rule may establish a variable speed 1-25 program to allow the temporary lowering of a prima facie speed limit to address inclement weather, congestion, road construction, or any other condition that affects the safe and orderly movement of traffic on a roadway for which the commission has the authority to 1-26 1-27 1-28 establish a speed limit. Notice of a speed limit established under 1-29 1-30 the program may be displayed using a stationary or portable changeable message sign, as defined by Section 544.013. The program may not authorize the lowering of a speed limit to divert traffic to a toll road for the purpose of increasing revenue from 1-31 1-32 1-33 toll charges. A speed limit that is established under the program: 1-34 (1) must be based on an engineering and traffic 1-35 investigation; (2) 1-36 (2) may be effective for all or a designated portion of the highway and may be effective for any period of the day or night, 1-37 1-38 as the Texas Department of Transportation determines necessary; 1-39 (3) may not be less than 10 miles per hour below the 1-40 prima facie speed limit on the portion of the highway to which it 1-41 applies; and 1-42 1-43 (4) is effective only when the speed limit is posted and only if a sign notifying motorists of the change in speed limit 1 - 44

1-45 is posted not less than 500 feet but not more than 1,000 feet before 1-46

the point at which the speed limit begins. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-47 1-48 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-49 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-50 1-51 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
