1-15 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

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1-17 relating to the disclosure of customer information by 1-18 government-operated utilities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 182.054, Utilities Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 182.054. EXCEPTIONS. This subchapter does not prohibit a government-operated utility from disclosing personal information in a customer's account record to:

- (1) an official or employee of the state, a political subdivision of the state, or the United States acting in an official capacity;
- (2) an employee of a utility acting in connection with the employee's duties;
 - (3) a consumer reporting agency;
- (4) a contractor or subcontractor approved by and providing services to the utility, the state, a political subdivision of the state, or the United States;
- (5) a person for whom the customer has contractually waived confidentiality for personal information; [ex]
- (6) another entity that provides water, wastewater, sewer, gas, garbage, electricity, or drainage service for compensation;
- transition of customers among retail electric providers under Section 40.053 or to comply with rules, guidelines, and procedures established by an independent organization certified under Section 39.151; or
- 1-44 (8) a retail electric provider, as defined by Section 1-45 31.002(17).

1-46 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-47 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-48 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-49 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-50 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
