A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to a study on potential improvements to training provided 1-17 1**-**18 to 9-1-1 emergency service call takers and dispatchers. 1-19

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

In this Act, "commission" means the Texas 1-20 SECTION 1. (a) 1-21 Commission on Law Enforcement.

(b) The commission, in consultation with the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service, shall conduct a study to identify potential improvements to training provided to 9-1-1 emergency 1-22 1-23 1-24 1-25 service call takers and dispatchers. 1-26

(c) In conducting the study, the commission shall consider:

1-27 1-28 (1) the effectiveness of current training provided to takers and dispatchers 9-1-1 emergency service call on communicating accurate information to law enforcement officers; 1-29
