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relating to the establishment of the Mold Assessment Remediation Advisory Board under the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 1958.001, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as follows:

"Advisory board" means the Mold Assessment and (1)Remediation Advisory Board.

(1-a) "Commission" means the Texas Commission of

(1-a) Licensing and Regulation.

SECTION 2. Chapter 1958, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subchapter A-1 to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER A-1. ADVISORY BOARD 1958.031. ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERSHIP. The Mold Assessment and Remediation Advisory Board consists of nine members appointed by the presiding officer of the commission, with the approval of the commission, as follows:
(1) three members who are

licensed and engage in mold assessment as consultants;

(2) three members who are licensed and engage in mold

(3) one member principally engaged in istatewise: who building is а contractor principally engaged in home construstatewide building trade association; in home construction and is a member of

(4) one member who is a representative of an accredited mold training provider; and

(5) one member who represents the public.

Appointments to the advisory board shall be made without the race, color, disability, sex, religion, regard to age, or national origin of the appointee.

(c) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the composition or duration of the advisory board or to the appointment the advisory board's presiding officer.

Sec. 1958.032. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Members the advisory board serve staggered six-year terms, with the terms of three members expiring on February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
(b) If a vacancy occurs during a member's term,

the

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C.S.S.B. No. 1213 with the approval of the presiding officer of the commission, with the commission, shall appoint a replacement who meets the qualifications for the vacant position to serve for the remainder of the term.

Sec. 1958.033. PRESIDING OFFICER. The presiding officer of the commission, with the approval of the commission, shall appoint one of the advisory board members to serve as presiding officer of the advisory board for a term of one year.

Sec. 1958.034. DUTIES. The advisory board may advise the commission and department on:

(1) technical matters relevant to the administration

of this chapter; (2) standards or performance and work practices for

mold assessment or remediation; (3) qualifications for the issuance or renewal of a

including any training or continuing education; and license, (4) other issues affecting mold assessment remediation.

SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2023, the presiding officer of the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall appoint members to the Mold Assessment and Remediation Advisory Board in accordance with Section 1958.031, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Section 1958.032, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, in making the initial appointments to the Mold Assessment and Remediation Advisory Board, the presiding officer of the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall designate three members of the advisory board to serve terms expiring February 1, 2025, three members to serve terms expiring February 1, 2027, and three members to serve terms expiring February 1, 2029.

This Act takes effect immediately if it receives SECTION 5. a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
