SECTION 1. Subchapter  $\mathbf{Z}$ , Chapter  $\mathbf{51}$ , Education Code, is amended by adding Section 51.987 to read as follows:

Sec. 51.987. CERTAIN ACADEMIC BOYCOTTS OF FOREIGN COUNTRIES PROHIBITED. (a) In this section, "institution of higher education" has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.

(b) Subject to Subsection (c), an institution of higher education may not implement an academic boycott of a foreign country that would prevent a student or faculty member of the
institution from:

(1) studying or conducting research in or about the country; or
