A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the prosecution of the criminal offense of failure to identify; creating a criminal offense.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 38.02, Penal Code, is amended by adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), (d-1), and (f) and amending Subsection (c) to read as follows:

(b-1) A person commits an offense if the person:

(1) is an operator of a motor vehicle, as defined by 32.34, who is lawfully detained by a peace officer for an alleged violation of a law;

(2) fails to provide or display the person's driver's license on the officer's request for the license; and

(3) intentionally refuses to give the person's name, driver's license number, residence address, or date of birth to the peace officer on the officer's request for that information.

(b-2) For purposes of Subsection (b-1)(3), giving a peace officer a residence address that is different from the address

- associated with the person's driver's license does not constitute a refusal to give the person's residence address in violation of that provision if the address given to the officer is the person's actual
- residence address.

 (c) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [Subsections] (d) <u>and</u>

 (d-1) [and (e)], an offense under this section is:
- (1) a Class C misdemeanor if the offense is committed
- under Subsection (a) or (b-1); or (2) a Class B misdemeanor if the offense is committed under Subsection (b).
- (d-1) An offense under Subsection (b-1) misdemeanor if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the actor gave a false or fictitious name to the peace officer during
- the commission of the offense.

 (f) Subject to Subsection (e), if conduct that constitutes 1-48 1-49 an offense under Subsection (b-1) also constitutes an offense under 1-50 any other law, the actor may be prosecuted under that subsection, 1-51 the other law, or both.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
