 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the composition of the radiation advisory board.
 1-22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 401.015(a), Health and Safety Code, is
 1-24 amended to read as follows:
 1-25 (a) The radiation advisory board is composed of the
 1-26 following 19 [~~18~~] members appointed by the governor:
 1-27 (1) one representative from industry who is trained in
 1-28 nuclear physics, science, or nuclear engineering;
 1-29 (2) one representative from labor;
 1-30 (3) one representative from agriculture;
 1-31 (4) one representative from the insurance industry;
 1-32 (5) one individual who is engaged in the use and
 1-33 application of nuclear physics in medicine and is certified by the
 1-34 American Board of Radiology or licensed by the Texas Medical Board
 1-35 under Chapter 602, Occupations Code;
 1-36 (6) one hospital administrator;
 1-37 (7) one individual licensed by the Texas Medical Board
 1-38 who specializes in nuclear medicine;
 1-39 (8) one individual licensed by the Texas Medical Board
 1-40 who specializes in pathology;
 1-41 (9) one individual licensed by the Texas Medical Board
 1-42 who specializes in radiology;
 1-43 (10) one representative from the nuclear utility
 1-44 industry;
 1-45 (11) one representative from the radioactive waste
 1-46 industry;
 1-47 (12) one representative from the petroleum industry;
 1-48 (13) one health physicist certified by the American
 1-49 Board of Health Physics;
 1-50 (14) one individual licensed by the State Board of
 1-51 Dental Examiners;
 1-52 (15) one representative from the uranium mining
 1-53 industry; ~~and~~
 1-54 (16) one individual licensed by the State Board of
 1-55 Veterinary Medical Examiners; and
 1-56 (17) three representatives of the public.
 1-57 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
 1-58 of this Act, the governor shall appoint an individual licensed by
 1-59 the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners to the radiation
 1-60 advisory board as required by Section 401.015, Health and Safety

2-1 Code, as amended by this Act.

2-2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
2-3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
2-4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
2-5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
2-6 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
