BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 29.0113 to read as follows:

Sec. 29.0113. DRIVING WITH DISABILITY PROGRAM INFORMATION. (a) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school shall provide information regarding the Texas Driving with Disability Program to:

(1)students who have a health condition or disability that may impede effective communication with a peace officer and:

who receive special education services under (A)

Subchapter A; or

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(B) who Section 504, are covered Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. Section 794); and

(2) the parents of students described by Subdivision (1).

The information described under Subsection (a) shall be (b) provided to each student who is 16 years of age or older and annually until the earlier of the student's:

(1) graduation from high school; or

SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 1001, Education Code, is

amended by adding Section 1001.10161 to read as follows:

Sec. 1001.10161. DRIVING WITH DISABILITY PROGRAM INFORMATION. The commission by rule shall require that information relating to the Texas Driving with Disability Program be included WITH in the curriculum of each driver education and driving safety

SECTION 4. (a) Not later than May 1, 2024, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt the rules required by Section 1001.10161, Education Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Not later than September 1, 2024, each provider of a driver education course or a driving safety course shall certify to the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation that the course curriculum has been updated to include the information required by Section 1001.10161, Education Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024

school year.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
