BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

ARTICLE 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDING
1. (a) The legislature, acting SECTION 1.01. (a) governor, has the solemn duty to protect and defend the citizens of this state and maintain sovereignty over this state's borders.

(b) An individual entering this state from a foreign country shall enter through a legal port of entry.

ARTICLE 2. BORDER PROTECTION AGREEMENTS

SECTION 2.01. Title 7, Government Code, is amended by adding Chapter 795 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 795. BORDER PROTECTION AGREEMENTS WITH UNITED MEXICAN STATES

AUTHORITY FOR AGREEMENTS AND ENGAGEMENT WITH Sec. 795.001. AUTHORITIES OF UNITED MEXICAN STATES. (a) On behalf of this state, the governor may coordinate, develop, and execute agreements with the United Mexican States and the states of the United Mexican States enhancing the authority of this state to protect and defend its citizens.

(b) The governor may appoint one or more individuals responsible for meeting in person with the appropriate local, state, and federal authorities of the United Mexican States to coordinate, develop, and execute agreements under Subsection (a). An individual appointed under this subsection:

(1) may operate within the United Mexican States as practicable; and

(2) is subject to Chapter 572 in the same manner as if the individual were a state employee.

ARTICLE 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 3.01. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
