1-15 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-16 AN ACT

1-17 relating to creating the criminal offense of jugging.  
1-18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:  
1-19 SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Penal Code, is amended by adding  
1-20 Section 29.04 to read as follows:  
1-21 Sec. 29.04. JUGGING. (a) A person commits an offense if,  
1-22 with the intent to commit theft of another person's money, the  
1-23 person:  
1-24 (1) knowingly travels from a commercial business or  
1-25 financial institution, as defined by Section 201.101, Finance Code,  
1-26 on the same path or route as another person without substantially  
1-27 deviating from that path or route; and  
1-28 (2) is in possession of two or more criminal  
1-29 instruments, as defined by Section 16.01.  
1-30 (b) An offense under this section is a state jail felony,  
1-31 except that the offense is:  
1-32 (1) a felony of the third degree if, during the  
1-33 commission of the offense, the actor commits an offense under  
1-34 Section 30.04; or  
1-35 (2) a felony of the first degree if, during the  
1-36 commission of the offense, the actor commits an offense under  
1-37 Section 29.02.  
1-38 (c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section  
1-39 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code, the  
1-40 actor may be prosecuted under either section or under both  
1-41 sections.  
1-42 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
