1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the determination of fees, charges, and rates for
1-20 certain benefits under Medicaid.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 32.028(c), Human Resources Code, is
1-23 amended to read as follows:

1-24 (c) The fee, charge, or rate for other medical assistance:

1-25 (1) is the usual and customary fee, charge, or rate
1-26 that prevails in the community unless the payment is limited by
1-27 state or federal law; and

1-28 (2) excludes any fee, charge, or rate offered as part
1-29 of a monthly fee-based membership discount program.

1-30 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
1-31 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
1-32 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
1-33 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
1-34 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
1-35 waiver or authorization is granted.

1-36 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
