1-14 AN ACT

1-15 relating to the disclosure of certain fraud detection information  
1-16 obtained in the administration of the unemployment compensation  
1-17 system.

1-18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-19 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 301, Labor Code, is  
1-20 amended by adding Section 301.087 to read as follows:

1-21 Sec. 301.087. CERTAIN FRAUD DETECTION INFORMATION NOT  
1-22 PUBLIC INFORMATION. (a) In this section, "fraud detection  
1-23 information" means any information, including risk assessments,  
1-24 reports, data, protocols, technology specifications, manuals,  
1-25 instructions, investigative materials, crossmatches, mental  
1-26 impressions, and communications, that may reveal the methods or  
1-27 means by which the commission prevents, investigates, or evaluates  
1-28 fraud in its administration of Subtitle A.

1-29 (b) Fraud detection information is not public information  
1-30 for purposes of Chapter 552, Government Code, and is excepted from  
1-31 the requirements of Section 552.021 of that code.

1-32 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
1-33 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
1-34 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
1-35 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
1-36 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
