BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. (a) In this section:

- "Advisory (1)board" means the established under this section.
 (2) "Commission"
- means the Texas Workforce Commission.
- (3) "Executive director" means the executive director of the Texas Workforce Commission.
- (b) The commission shall establish an advisory board to develop a resource guide that facilitates collaborations among health care providers and institutions of higher education in more effectively identifying and addressing local health care workforce needs, including training, workforce shortages, and challenging workloads.
- The advisory board consists of the following members (c) appointed by the executive director:
- (1)one member from a two-year institution of higher education in an urban area;
- one member from a two-year institution of higher (2) education in a rural area;
- (3) one member from a public four-year institution of higher education in an urban area;
- (4)one member from a public four-year institution of higher education in a rural area;
- (5) members representing three local workforce development boards in geographically diverse areas of this state;
- (6) two members from statewide organizations representing hospitals;
- (7) two members from statewide organizations representing health care professionals; and
- 1-47 1-48 (8) two statewide members from organizations 1-49 representing community health centers.
 - (d) The advisory board shall elect from among the members a presiding officer.
 - (e) The advisory board shall meet periodically and at the call of the presiding officer.
 - (f) Not later than November 1, 2026, the commission shall prepare and submit to the legislature the resource guide developed under Subsection (b) of this section.
