A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to reporting certain information regarding the placement of children and suits filed by the Department of Family Protective Services.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Sections 264.017(b) and (f), Family Code, are amended to read as follows:

- The department shall provide the report required by Subsection (a) to the legislature and shall publish the report and make the report available electronically to the public not later than February 1 of each year. The report must include, with respect to the preceding year:
- (1)information on the number and disposition of
- reports of child abuse and neglect received by the department;
 (2) information on the number of clients for whom the took protective action, including investigations, department alternative responses, and court-ordered removals;
- (3) information on the number of clients for whom the department provided services in each program administered by the child protective services division, including investigations, safety alternative responses, family-based services, conservatorship, post-adoption services, and transitional living services;
- (4)the number of children in this state who died as a result of child abuse or neglect;
- (5) the number of children described by Subdivision (4) for whom the department was the children's managing conservator at the time of death;
- information on the timeliness of the department's (6) initial contact in an investigation or alternative response;
- (7) information on the response time by the department in commencing services to families and children for whom an allegation of child abuse or neglect has been made;
- (8) information regarding child protection staffing and caseloads by program area;
- (9) information on the permanency goals in place and achieved for children in the managing conservatorship of the department, including information on the timeliness of achieving the goals, the stability of the children's placement in foster care, and the proximity of placements to the children's home counties;
