BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 571.171, Government Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

(d) This section does not require the exhaustion of civil, including administrative, remedies as a prerequisite to the vesting in a trial court of subject matter jurisdiction over a criminal action for which the trial court would otherwise have jurisdiction under other law.

SECTION 2. SECTION 2. This Act applies to a criminal action commenced before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.
