1-14 AN ACT

1-15 relating to the continuation of the Task Force on Consolidation of
1-16 Workforce and Social Services.

1-17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-18 SECTION 1. Section 319.005, Labor Code, is amended to read
1-19 as follows:

1-20 Sec. 319.005. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than
1-21 December 31 of each even-numbered year~~[, 2024]~~, the task force
1-22 shall prepare and submit to the legislature a report that includes:

1-23 (1) a description of the activities of the task force;
1-24 (2) the consolidation plan developed by the task
1-25 force; and

1-26 (3) the findings and recommendations of the task
1-27 force.

1-28 SECTION 2. Section 319.006, Labor Code, is amended to read
1-29 as follows:

1-30 Sec. 319.006. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and
1-31 this chapter expires September 1, 2027~~[2025]~~.

1-32 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-33 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-34 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-35 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-36 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
