SECTION 1. Section 544.002, Insurance Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

(d) Notwithstanding Section 544.003, an insurer may not:

(1) refuse to continue to insure or provide coverage to an individual or limit the amount, extent, or kind of coverage available to an individual because the individual is widowed or the individual's marital status otherwise reflects the death of a

spouse; or
