1-21 relating to the authority of the governing board of a state 1-22 governmental body to conduct a closed meeting to deliberate an 1-23 issue involving certain defense, military, or aerospace issues. 1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 551, Government Code, is 1-26 amended by adding Section 551.092 to read as follows:

1-27 Sec. 551.092. STATE GOVERNMENTAL BODIES: DEFENSE, 1-28 MILITARY, AND AEROSPACE ISSUES; CLOSED MEETING. (a) In this 1-29 section, "defense, military, or aerospace issue" means a matter 1-30 related to:

1-31 (1) the establishment of an office, base, or major 1-32 facility in this state by the United States Department of Defense or 1-33 the National Aeronautics and Space Administration; or

1-34 (2) an economic incentive a governmental body may 1-35 offer to a private entity or nonprofit organization to meet a match 1-36 requirement or other requirement established by the United States 1-37 Department of Defense or the National Aeronautics and Space 1-38 Administration in relation to grants or strategic endeavors.

1-39 (b) The governing board of a governmental body described by 1-40 Section 551.001(3)(A) may conduct a closed meeting to deliberate a 1-41 defense, military, or aerospace issue.

1-41 defense, military, or aerospace issue. 1-42 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-43 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-44 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-45 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-46 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
