1-16 AN ACT

1-17 relating to the disclosure of certain information by the Texas
1-18 Juvenile Justice Department.

1-19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-20 SECTION 1. Section 244.003, Human Resources Code, is
1-21 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to
1-22 read as follows:

1-23 (b) Except as provided by Section 243.051(c), these records
1-24 and all other information concerning a child, including personally
1-25 identifiable information, are not public and are available only
1-26 according to the provisions of Subsection (c) of this section,
1-27 Section 58.005, Family Code, Section 244.051 of this code, and
1-28 Chapter 67, Code of Criminal Procedure.

1-29 (c) The department may disclose information concerning a
1-30 person who was committed to the department, including personally
1-31 identifiable information, if:

1-32 (1) the person:

1-33 (A) has been discharged from commitment by the
1-34 department;

1-35 (B) is at least 18 years of age; and

1-36 (C) has given consent for the department to
1-37 disclose the information; and

1-38 (2) the department does not disclose any information
1-39 for which the person did not consent to disclosure and does not
1-40 disclose any information for a purpose other than the purpose for
1-41 which the person consented to disclosure.

1-42 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
