1-15 SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1-16 WHEREAS, The Town of Trophy Club has demonstrated an  
1-17 exceptional commitment to fostering patriotism among its  
1-18 citizenry; and

1-19 WHEREAS, In 1985, the year of its incorporation, Trophy Club  
1-20 raised the American flag at the intersection of State Highway 114  
1-21 and Trophy Club Drive; this location at the entrance to the town had  
1-22 hosted Independence Day celebrations carried out by local families  
1-23 since the early 1970s; today, the flag continues to fly at the site,  
1-24 a proud symbol of the town residents' love of country; Old Glory is  
1-25 also displayed daily at seven other civic spaces thanks to the  
1-26 efforts of the Trophy Club Fire Department, and every Fourth of  
1-27 July, the Stars & Stripes Committee places flags along every street  
1-28 in town; and

1-29 WHEREAS, Trophy Club originated as a small, golf-centric  
1-30 retreat that quickly became home to numerous Dallas-area executives  
1-31 and retirees; over the years, the master-planned town has grown  
1-32 into a lively residential community with more than 14,000  
1-33 residents; the population is deeply engaged in community-oriented  
1-34 activities, including school functions, church services, and the  
1-35 meetings of town advisory groups, clubs, and other organizations;  
1-36 local events such as the Medal of Honor Motorcade Celebration,  
1-37 Patriot Day Ceremony, and Memorial Day Ceremony are designed to  
1-38 bring people together, strengthen bonds, and encourage a spirit of  
1-39 service among citizens of all ages; and

1-40 WHEREAS, In 2014, Trophy Club adopted a logo that reflects  
1-41 the town's deep sense of patriotism, and its red, white, and blue  
1-42 design features a star as a key element; the town has given its  
1-43 public spaces such names as Independence Park, Freedom Dog Park,  
1-44 and Harmony Park, signaling a love of liberty and unity and a  
1-45 respect for those who have served in the nation's military;  
1-46 Veteran's Memorial Park, located on land donated by the town, was  
1-47 established by the Trophy Club Women's Club and is maintained by the  
1-48 town in association with the Metroport Veterans Association; other  
1-49 patriotic civic groups include the Honor Our Wounded Military  
1-50 Foundation and Trophy Club Rotary; and

1-51 WHEREAS, Since its inception, the Town of Trophy Club has set  
1-52 an inspiring example by making patriotism a centerpiece of  
1-53 community life and civic engagement, and its efforts deserve to be  
1-54 duly recognized; now, therefore, be it

1-55 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas  
1-56 hereby designate the Town of Trophy Club as the official Texas Town  
1-57 of Patriotism; and, be it further

1-58 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of  
1-59 Section 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in  
1-60 effect until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is  
1-61 finally passed by the legislature.
