RESOLVED, That the Texas Legislature encourage continued collaboration between federal and state entities to enhance energy production, maritime trade, and resource management in the Gulf of America; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Texas Legislature oppose any federal overreach that would undermine Texas' control over its coastal resources and call for policies that prioritize state rights and economic prosperity.
