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## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1-16 proposing a constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature 1-17 to provide for a temporary exemption from ad valorem taxation of the 1-18 appraised value of an improvement to a residence homestead that is 1-19 completely destroyed by a fire.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 1-b, Article VIII, Texas Constitution, 1-22 is amended by adding Subsection (z) to read as follows: 1-23 (z) The legislature by general law may provide for a

1-23 (z) The legislature by general law may provide for a 1-24 temporary exemption from ad valorem taxation of the appraised value 1-25 of an improvement to a person's residence homestead that is 1-26 completely destroyed by a fire. The legislature by general law may 1-27 prescribe the duration of the exemption and may provide additional 1-28 eligibility requirements for the exemption.

1-29 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 1-30 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2025. 1-31 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the 1-32 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to authorize the 1-33 legislature to provide for a temporary exemption from ad valorem 1-34 taxation of the appraised value of an improvement to a residence 1-35 homestead that is completely destroyed by a fire."

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
