4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 51, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter I to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER I. TEXTBOOKS
8	51.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Bundle" means a single package containing a
10	textbook along with other materials.
11	(2) "Board" has the meaning assigned by Section
12	<u>61.003.</u>
13	(3) "Commission" refers to the Texas Building and
14	Procurement Commission.
15	(4) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
16	assigned by Section 61.003.
17	(5) "Open access publications" are peer reviewed
18	publications written by identified authors who are subject experts,
19	which are available free of charge over the Internet.
20	(6) "Textbook" means a book, a system of instructional

materials, or a combination of a book and supplementary

instructional materials that conveys information to the student or

(7) "University-affiliated bookstore" means a store

otherwise contributes to the learning process.

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- 1 that sells textbooks, whether or not located on the campus of an
- 2 institution of higher education, that is operated by or with the
- 3 approval of the institution through ownership, a management
- 4 agreement, a lease or rental agreement, or otherwise.
- 5 51.452. COST CONSIDERATIONS. (a) Each faculty member shall
- 6 take cost into consideration in selecting textbooks required for
- 7 <u>use in a course.</u>
- 8 (b) A faculty member shall not require students to purchase
- 9 any textbook that is not expected to be used in the course.
- 10 (c) Faculty members shall consider the use of open access
- 11 publications where such publications are more economical than
- 12 textbooks and provide the necessary content for the course.
- (d) The board shall monitor costs of textbooks and
- 14 periodically recommend to the legislature ways to lower the costs
- of textbooks for students at institutions of higher education.
- 16 51.453. LENGTH OF USE. (a) Except as provided by
- 17 Subsection (b), each textbook that a student is required to use
- shall be in print for no fewer than three years from initial release
- 19 without being superseded by a newer edition.
- 20 (b) A faculty member may require a textbook that is revised
- 21 more frequently than allowed by this section for a valid
- 22 educational or cost reason with approval of the department chair or
- 23 other official designated by the university.
- 24 51.454. LIST OF REQUIRED TEXTBOOKS. (a) Each institution
- of higher education shall compile a list of required textbooks for
- 26 each course and post that list on a website available to students.
- 27 The list must include the International Standard Book Number for

- 1 <u>each textbook</u>, if one has been assigned.
- 2 (b) An institution shall post the list required under
- 3 Subsection (a) as soon as practicable and in no event later than one
- 4 week after such information is made available to the
- 5 university-affiliated bookstore.
- 6 (c) Each institution of higher education shall set a
- 7 deadline for submission of textbook lists by faculty that will
- 8 allow for timely placement of orders.
- 9 51.455. SALE AND ADVERTISING. (a) An institution of higher
- 10 education shall not restrict a retailer or other provider of
- 11 textbooks from advertising or promoting on campus except as such
- 12 restrictions apply to advertising or promoting on campus in
- 13 general, except that this subsection does not require that
- 14 competitive advertising be allowed within the confines of a
- 15 university-affiliated bookstore.
- 16 (b) If an institution of higher education works in
- 17 conjunction with a university-affiliated bookstore to provide a
- 18 method for the extension of credit or the ability of a student to
- 19 charge or otherwise delay the payment of the costs of instructional
- 20 materials, including the extension of credit under Section
- 21 51.929(b), the institution shall, to the extent practicable,
- 22 <u>establish similar arrangements with other retailers that sell</u>
- 23 <u>required textbooks. The institution may set reasonable conditions</u>
- 24 for a retailer to meet but such conditions may not be used to
- 25 provide a substantial advantage to the university-affiliated
- 26 bookstore.
- 51.456. BUNDLES. (a) A university-affiliated bookstore

- 1 <u>shall not sell instructional materials as a bundle unless:</u>
- 2 (1) all items in the bundle are required by a faculty
- 3 member; or
- 4 (2) the bundle price is lower than the total price of
- 5 all of the required materials sold separately.
- 6 (b) A faculty member shall not require a bundle unless:
- 7 (1) all materials in the bundle are intended to be used
- 8 in the course; or
- 9 (2) the bundle price is lower than the total price of
- 10 the materials intended to be used in the course sold separately.
- 11 (c) A university-affiliated bookstore that allows students
- 12 to return textbooks shall not penalize a student for opening a
- 13 required bundle or opening materials within the bundle as long as
- 14 all other conditions of the return policy are met.
- 51.457. STATE PURCHASING PRICE FOR TEXTBOOKS.
- 16 (a) The commission shall negotiate discount pricing with
- 17 publishers of textbooks used in institutions of higher education.
- 18 If the publisher and the commission reach an agreement on prices,
- 19 they shall enter into a contract for the publisher to sell textbooks
- 20 to university-affiliated bookstores at discounted prices.
- 21 (b) University-affiliated bookstores that purchase
- 22 textbooks from publishers at discounted prices, as provided by
- 23 Subsection (a), shall reflect the discount in the retail price
- charged to students.
- 25 (c) Only textbooks meeting the requirements of Sections
- 26 51.453 and 51.456 may be covered by the contracts under this
- 27 section.

- 1 (d) At least two months in advance of the deadline as
- 2 established by Section 51.453 (c), the commission shall make a list
- 3 of books subject to discount pricing under this section. The
- 4 commission shall post this list on the Internet.
- 5 (e) The commission may adopt rules necessary to administer
- 6 this section.
- 7 <u>51.458. ACCEPTING REBATE ON TEXTBOOKS PROHIBITED. (a) A</u>
- 8 college or university trustee, administrator, or faculty member
- 9 commits an offense if that person receives any commission or rebate
- on any textbooks used in the institutions with which the person is
- 11 associated as a trustee, administrator, or faculty member.
- 12 (b) A college or university trustee, administrator, or
- 13 faculty member commits an offense if the person accepts a gift,
- 14 favor, or service that:
- 15 (1) is given to the person or the person's institution;
- 16 <u>and</u>
- 17 (2) might reasonably tend to influence a trustee,
- 18 administrator, or faculty member in the selection of a textbook.
- 19 (c) An offense under this section is a Class B misdemeanor.
- 20 (d) In this section, "gift, favor, or service" does not
- 21 <u>include:</u>
- 22 (1) staff development, in-service, or faculty
- 23 training;
- 24 (2) sample copies, instructor's copies or
- 25 <u>instructional materials</u>, such as maps or worksheets, that convey
- 26 information to the student or otherwise contribute to the learning
- 27 process; or

- 1 (3) royalties or other compensation from sales of
- 2 textbooks for a faculty member's own writing or work.
- 3 51.459. OPEN ACCESS PUBLICATIONS. The board shall work with
- 4 institutions of higher education and others to facilitate the
- 5 development of open access publications.
- 6 SECTION 2. The change in law made by adding Section 51.458,
- 7 Education Code applies only to an offense committed on or after the
- 8 effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the
- 9 effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the
- 10 offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 11 that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed
- 12 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 13 occurs before the effective date.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect on September 1, 2007.
