A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to an interim study concerning the state's demand for
- 3 electric generation capacity, the development of a long-term energy
- 4 plan, and the effects on the environment of electric generating
- 5 facilities.

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- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. COMPOSITION OF COMMITTEE. (a) The Interim
- 8 Special Committee on Electric Energy Generation Capacity and
- 9 Environmental Impact is composed of:
- 10 (1) the chair of the House Environmental Regulation
- 11 Committee;
- 12 (2) the chair of the House Energy Resources Committee;
- 13 (3) the chair of the House Committee on Regulated
- 14 Industries;
- 15 (4) the chair of the Senate Natural Resources
- 16 Committee;
- 17 (5) the chair of the Senate Business and Commerce
- 18 Committee;
- 19 (6) four members of the house of representatives,
- 20 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and
- 21 (7) five members of the senate, appointed by the
- 22 lieutenant governor.
- 23 (b) The speaker of the house of representatives and the
- lieutenant governor shall each designate a co-chair from among the

- 1 committee members.
- 2 (c) Not later than the 60th day after the effective date of
- 3 this Act, the speaker of the house of representatives and the
- 4 lieutenant governor shall appoint the members of the interim
- 5 committee.
- 6 SECTION 2. STUDY; PLAN. (a) The committee shall:
- 7 (1) study the state's demand for electric generation
- 8 capacity for the next 25 years and the infrastructure and
- 9 technology available for meeting that demand;
- 10 (2) study the environmental effects of existing
- 11 electric generating facilities; and
- 12 (3) prepare a long-term electric energy and
- 13 environmental impact plan for the 80th Legislature that includes:
- 14 (A) an estimate of the demand for electric
- 15 generation capacity by this state for each of the next 25 years;
- 16 (B) an inventory of all existing electric
- 17 generating facilities operating in this state;
- 18 (C) an assessment of the types of, and amount of
- 19 electric generation capacity from, electric generation technology
- 20 available to be used to meet the demand for generation capacity,
- 21 including:
- 22 (i) coal;
- 23 (ii) renewable energy;
- 24 (iii) liquefied natural gas;
- 25 (iv) nuclear energy; and
- 26 (v) integrated gasification combined cycle
- 27 technology; and

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- 1 (D) an assessment of the environmental effects of
- 2 existing and potential electric generating facilities and energy
- 3 generation technology, including the effects on:
- 4 (i) the emission of pollutants regulated by
- 5 the federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. Section 7412);
- 6 (ii) the effect on air quality in
- 7 nonattainment areas; and
- 8 (iii) whether an increase in emissions
- 9 would cause an area to become a nonattainment area.
- 10 (b) In preparing the plan required by Subsection (a), the
- 11 committee may consult with:
- 12 (1) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality;
- 13 (2) the Public Utility Commission of Texas; and
- 14 (3) the Railroad Commission of Texas.
- 15 (c) The committee shall file with the legislature the
- 16 long-term electric energy and environmental impact plan required by
- 17 Subsection (a) not later than January 15, 2009.
- 18 SECTION 3. COMMITTEE MEETINGS. The joint interim committee
- 19 shall meet initially at the joint call of the co-chairs, and the
- 20 committee shall subsequently hold meetings and public hearings at
- 21 the call of the co-chairs.
- 22 SECTION 4. COMMITTEE POWERS AND DUTIES. The committee has
- 23 all powers and duties provided to special committees by the senate
- 24 and house of representatives rules of procedure, by Subchapter B,
- 25 Chapter 301, Government Code, and by policies of the committees on
- 26 administration.
- 27 SECTION 5. COMMITTEE FUNDING. (a) From the contingent

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- 1 expense fund of the senate and the contingent expense fund of the
- 2 house of representatives equally, the members of the committee
- 3 shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in carrying out the
- 4 provisions of this Act in accordance with the senate and house of
- 5 representatives rules of procedure and the policies of the
- 6 committees on administration.
- 7 (b) Other necessary expenses of operation shall be paid from
- 8 the contingent expense fund of the senate and the contingent
- 9 expense fund of the house of representatives equally.
- 10 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 11 1, 2007.
