## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature
- 2 to exempt from ad valorem taxation one or more passenger cars or
- 3 light trucks owned by an individual and used in the course of the
- 4 owner's occupation or profession and also for personal activities
- 5 of the owner.
- 6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 1(d), Article VIII, Texas Constitution,
- 8 is amended to read as follows:
- 9 (d) The Legislature by general law shall exempt from ad
- 10 valorem taxation household goods not held or used for the
- 11 production of income and personal effects not held or used for the
- 12 production of income. The Legislature by general law may exempt
- 13 from ad valorem taxation:
- 14 (1) all or part of the personal property homestead of a
- 15 family or single adult, "personal property homestead" meaning that
- 16 personal property exempt by law from forced sale for debt;
- 17 (2) subject to Subsections (e) and (g) of this
- 18 section, all other tangible personal property, except structures
- 19 which are substantially affixed to real estate and are used or
- 20 occupied as residential dwellings and except property held or used
- 21 for the production of income; [and]
- 22 (3) subject to Subsection (e) of this section, a
- leased motor vehicle that is not held primarily for the production
- of income by the lessee and that otherwise qualifies under general

- 1 law for exemption; and
- 2 (4) subject to Subsection (e) of this section, one or
- 3 more passenger cars or light trucks, as defined by the Legislature,
- 4 owned by an individual that are used in the course of the
- 5 individual's occupation or profession and are also used for
- 6 personal activities of the owner that do not involve the production
- 7 of income.
- 8 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
- 9 the Texas Constitution:
- 10 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies to
- 11 the constitutional amendment proposed by the 80th Legislature,
- 12 Regular Session, 2007, authorizing the legislature to exempt from
- 13 ad valorem taxation one or more passenger cars or light trucks owned
- 14 by an individual and used in the course of the owner's occupation or
- 15 profession and also for personal activities of the owner and
- 16 <u>expires January 1, 2009.</u>
- 17 (b) The amendment to Section 1(d), Article VIII, of this
- 18 constitution takes effect on the date of the official canvass of
- 19 returns showing adoption of the amendment and applies beginning
- with the tax year that begins January 1, 2007. The legislature may
- 21 <u>enact a general law authorized by the constitutional amendment that</u>
- 22 applies to the entire 2007 tax year, notwithstanding that the
- 23 constitutional amendment was adopted after the beginning of that
- tax year, and a general law applicable to the entire 2007 tax year
- is not considered to be a retroactive law.
- SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 6, 2007.

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- 1 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 2 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the
- 3 legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation one or more
- 4 passenger cars or light trucks owned by an individual and used in
- 5 the course of the owner's occupation or profession and also for
- 6 personal activities of the owner."
