relating to the establishment of the Legislative Committee on Aging
and other initiatives relating to the aging population of this
state.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Human Resources Code, is amended by
adding Subchapters G and H to read as follows:
SUBCHAPTER G. LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON AGING
Sec. 161.251. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
(1) "Committee" means the Legislative Committee on
Aging.

- 12 (2) "Health and human services agency" has the meaning
- 13 assigned by Section 531.001, Government Code.
- 14 Sec. 161.252. LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON AGING ESTABLISHED.
- 15 The Legislative Committee on Aging is established to:
- 16 (1) study issues relating to the aging population of
- 17 Texas, including issues related to the health care, income,
- 18 transportation, housing, education, and employment needs of that
- 19 population; and
- 20 (2) make recommendations to address those issues.
- Sec. 161.253. COMPOSITION OF COMMITTEE; PRESIDING OFFICER.
- 22 (a) The committee is composed of:
- (1) two members of the senate and one public member
- 24 appointed by the lieutenant governor; and

- 1 (2) two members of the house of representatives and
- 2 one public member appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 3 representatives.
- 4 (b) A member of the committee serves at the pleasure of the
- 5 appointing official.
- 6 (c) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
- 7 representatives shall appoint the presiding officer of the
- 8 committee on an alternating basis. The presiding officer shall
- 9 serve a two-year term expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered
- 10 year.
- 11 Sec. 161.254. COMMITTEE POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The
- 12 committee shall:
- 13 (1) meet at the call of the presiding officer;
- 14 (2) conduct a continuing study of issues relating to
- 15 the aging population;
- 16 (3) analyze the availability of, and unmet needs for,
- 17 state and local services for the aging population; and
- 18 (4) request reports and other information relating to
- 19 the aging population as necessary from the executive commissioner,
- 20 the department, other health and human services agencies, the
- 21 attorney general, and any other state agency.
- 22 <u>(b) The executive commissioner, the department, other</u>
- 23 health and human services agencies, the attorney general, and any
- 24 other applicable state agency shall fully cooperate with the
- 25 committee in performing the committee's duties under this
- 26 subchapter.
- 27 (c) The committee may issue process, in accordance with

- 1 Section 301.024, Government Code, to compel attendance of witnesses
- 2 and the production of books, records, documents, and instruments
- 3 required by the committee.
- 4 (d) The committee shall use the existing staff resources of
- 5 the senate and the house of representatives to assist the committee
- 6 in performing its duties under this section.
- 7 <u>Sec. 161.255.</u> REPORT. (a) The committee shall report to
- 8 the standing committees of the senate and house of representatives
- 9 having jurisdiction of issues related to the needs of the aging
- 10 population not later than November 15 of each even-numbered year.
- 11 (b) The report must include:
- 12 (1) a summary of the hearings and studies conducted by
- 13 the committee during the preceding year;
- 14 (2) a statement of findings based on the hearings and
- 15 studies conducted by the committee; and
- 16 <u>(3) recommendations for legislation.</u>
- 17 SUBCHAPTER H. CERTAIN INITIATIVES RELATING TO AGING
- Sec. 161.301. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "fund" means
- 19 the Chris Kyker Endowment for Seniors Fund established under this
- 20 subchapter.
- Sec. 161.302. CONTRACT TO PROVIDE OUTREACH AND INPUT
- 22 RELATING TO AGING POPULATION. (a) The executive commissioner may
- 23 contract with an entity to:
- 24 (1) conduct local forums throughout this state to
- 25 solicit input on and discuss policies regarding aging-related
- 26 issues;
- 27 (2) provide analysis, education, and research

- 1 services with respect to aging-related issues; and
- 2 (3) identify problems encountered by the aging
- 3 population in this state and develop and recommend to the executive
- 4 commissioner and the legislature solutions to those problems.
- 5 (b) To be eligible for a contract under this section, an
- 6 entity must:
- 7 (1) be a statewide organization that:
- 8 (A) is a Texas nonprofit organization, as that
- 9 term is defined by Section 161.075; and
- 10 <u>(B) represents people who are 60 years of age or</u>
- 11 older; and
- 12 (2) have experience and a proven history of conducting
- 13 local forums of the kind required by Subsection (a)(1) and
- 14 recommending solutions to problems encountered by the aging
- 15 population of this state.
- 16 <u>(c) A contract entered into under this section may include a</u>
- 17 provision that allows a person performing duties under the contract
- 18 on behalf of the entity to receive a per diem for days spent
- 19 performing those duties and reimbursement for the reasonable travel
- 20 expenses incurred in performing those duties at the same rate set in
- 21 the General Appropriations Act for state employees.
- 22 <u>Sec. 161.303. ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF FUND.</u>
- 23 (a) The Chris Kyker Endowment for Seniors Fund is established as a
- 24 special fund in the treasury outside the general revenue fund.
- 25 (b) The fund consists of:
- 26 (1) money transferred to the fund at the direction of
- 27 the legislature;

- 1 (2) grants, gifts, and donations from any other public
- 2 or private source contributed to the fund; and
- 3 (3) income and interest earned on money in the fund,
- 4 including depository interest.
- 5 (c) The comptroller shall administer and invest the fund.
- 6 (d) The fund is exempt from the application of Sections
- 7 403.095 and 404.071, Government Code.
- 8 Sec. 161.304. USE OF FUND. (a) The following may be
- 9 appropriated only to fund a contract entered into under Section
- 10 161.302:
- 11 (1) contributions to the fund described by Section
- 12 161.303(b)(2); and
- 13 (2) income and interest earned on money in the fund
- 14 described by Section 161.303(b)(3).
- (b) Except as provided by Subsection (a), money in the fund
- 16 may not be appropriated for any purpose.
- 17 (c) The executive commissioner may adopt rules regarding
- 18 distribution of funding appropriated in accordance with this
- 19 section.
- 20 SECTION 2. The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the
- 21 house of representatives shall appoint members of the Legislative
- 22 Committee on Aging, as established by this Act, not later than the
- 23 30th day after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
