A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to open-source textbooks for public schools.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 31.002, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 31.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 7 (1) "Electronic textbook" means computer software,
- 8 interactive videodisc, magnetic media, CD-ROM, computer
- 9 courseware, on-line services, an electronic medium, or other means
- 10 of conveying information to the student or otherwise contributing
- 11 to the learning process through electronic means, including an
- 12 open-source textbook.
- 13 (2) "Open-source textbook" means an electronic
- 14 textbook that is available for downloading from the Internet at no
- 15 charge to all students, without requiring the purchase of an unlock
- 16 code, membership, or any other access or use charge, except for a
- 17 charge to order an optional printed copy of all or part of the
- 18 <u>textbook</u>.
- 19 $\underline{(3)}$ [$\underline{(2)}$] "Publisher" includes an on-line service or a
- 20 developer or distributor of an electronic textbook.
- (4) $[\frac{3}{3}]$ "Textbook" means a book, a system of
- 22 instructional materials, or a combination of a book and
- 23 supplementary instructional materials that conveys information to
- 24 the student or otherwise contributes to the learning process, or an

- 1 electronic textbook.
- (5) [(4)] "Technological equipment" means hardware, a
- 3 device, or equipment necessary for:
- 4 (A) instructional use in the classroom,
- 5 including to gain access to or enhance the use of an electronic
- 6 textbook; or
- 7 (B) professional use by a classroom teacher.
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 31, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 9 Section 31.0245 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 31.0245. ADOPTION OF OPEN-SOURCE TEXTBOOKS WRITTEN AND
- 11 PUBLISHED BY INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. (a) The State
- 12 Board of Education shall place an open-source textbook for a
- 13 secondary level course submitted for adoption by a public or
- 14 private university located in Texas that spends at least \$75
- 15 million per year on research as reported to the Texas Higher
- 16 Education Coordinating Board under section 61.051 (h), or a Texas
- 17 public technical institute as defined in Section 61.003, on a
- 18 conforming or nonconforming list, as determined by the
- 19 university's or institute's certification, if:
- 20 <u>(1)</u> the open-source textbook is written, compiled or
- 21 edited primarily by faculty of the university or institute
- 22 submitting the textbook who specialize in the subject area of the
- 23 <u>textbook;</u>
- 24 (2) all contributing authors to the open-source
- 25 textbook are identified by the university or institute submitting
- 26 the textbook;
- 27 (3) the open-source textbook is certified for accuracy

- 1 by the department of the university or institute that teaches the
- 2 subject area of the textbook;
- 3 (4) the university or institute submitting the
- 4 textbook determines that the textbook qualifies for placement on
- 5 the either the conforming or nonconforming list, and certifies
- 6 this to the Board;
- 7 (5) the university or institute submitting the
- 8 textbook for a senior year secondary course certifies that a
- 9 student who successfully completes a course based on the textbook
- 10 will be prepared, without remediation, for entry into the freshman
- 11 college course in that subject at that university or institute; and
- 12 (6) the university or institute submitting the
- 13 textbook for junior and senior year secondary courses certifies
- 14 that a student who successfully completes a course based on the
- 15 junior year textbook will be prepared for entry into the senior
- 16 year course.
- 17 (b) This section does not prohibit an educational
- 18 institution described in this section from submitting textbooks
- 19 for placement on conforming or nonconforming lists through any
- 20 other adoption process provided in this chapter.
- SECTION 3. Section 31.026, Education Code, is amended by
- 22 adding subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 23 <u>(d) This section does not apply to an open-source textbook.</u>
- SECTION 4. Chapter 31, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 25 Section 31.0265 to read as follows:
- Sec. 31.0265. CONTRACTS FOR PRINTING OF OPEN-SOURCE
- 27 TEXTBOOKS. The State Board of Education may execute contracts for

- 1 the printing of open-source textbooks listed on the conforming and
- 2 non-conforming lists. The contracts shall allow school districts
- 3 to requisition printed copies of open-source textbooks as provided
- 4 in Section 31.103.
- 5 SECTION 5. Section 31.207, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 (c) This section does not apply to an open-source textbook.
- 8 SECTION 6. Section 31.103, Education Code, is amended by
- 9 adding subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 10 (d) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 11 that selects an open-source textbook shall requisition enough
- 12 printed copies of the open-source textbook to assure that students
- 13 who do not have the technological equipment necessary to use the
- 14 open-source textbook receive a printed copy, unless the district
- 15 provides for the student to have the necessary equipment at no
- 16 charge to the student or arranges for the student to receive bound
- 17 printed copies of portions of the book that will be used for the
- 18 class.
- 19 SECTION 7. Section 31.104 is amended by amending
- 20 subsections (b) and (c), and adding subsection (f) to read as
- 21 follows:
- 22 (b) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may
- 23 order replacements for textbooks that have been lost or damaged
- 24 directly from:
- 25 (1) the textbook depository; or
- 26 (2) the textbook publisher or manufacturer if the
- 27 textbook publisher or manufacturer does not have a designated

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- 1 textbook depository in this state under Section 31.151(a)(6)(B),
- 2 except that a printed copy of an open-source textbook may be
- 3 ordered from any source.
- 4 (c) Each textbook must state that the textbook is the
- 5 property of or is licensed to this state, as appropriate. Each
- 6 textbook, other than an electronic textbook or a printed copy of an
- 7 open-source textbook, must be covered by the student under the
- 8 direction of the teacher. A student must return all textbooks to
- 9 the teacher at the end of the school year or when the student
- 10 withdraws from school, except that a printed copy of an open-source
- 11 textbook need not be returned if the school district or
- 12 open-enrollment charter school does not intend to use the textbook
- 13 <u>for another student</u>.
- 14 (f) This section does not apply to the electronic copy of an
- 15 open-source textbook.
- SECTION 8. Section 31.151 (a), Education Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- Section. 31.151. DUTIES OF PUBLISHERS AND MANUFACTURERS. (a)
- 19 A publisher or manufacturer of textbooks:
- 20 (1) shall furnish any textbook the publisher or
- 21 manufacturer offers in this state, at a price that does not exceed
- 22 the lowest price at which the publisher offers that textbook for
- 23 adoption or sale to any state, public school, or school district in
- 24 the United States;
- 25 (2) shall automatically reduce the price of a textbook
- 26 sold for use in a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 27 to the extent that the price is reduced elsewhere in the United

- 1 States;
- 2 (3) shall provide any textbook or ancillary item free
- 3 of charge in this state to the same extent that the publisher or
- 4 manufacturer provides the textbook or ancillary item free of charge
- 5 to any state, public school, or school district in the United
- 6 States;
- 7 (4) shall guarantee that each copy of a textbook sold
- 8 in this state is at least equal in quality to copies of that
- 9 textbook sold elsewhere in the United States and is free from
- 10 factual error;
- 11 (5) may not become associated or connected with,
- 12 directly or indirectly, any combination in restraint of trade in
- 13 textbooks or enter into any understanding or combination to control
- 14 prices or restrict competition in the sale of textbooks for use in
- 15 this state;
- 16 (6) shall:
- 17 (A) maintain a depository in this state or
- 18 arrange with a depository in this state to receive and fill orders
- 19 for textbooks, other than open-source textbooks, on-line textbooks
- 20 or on-line textbook components, consistent with State Board of
- 21 Education rules; or
- 22 (B) deliver textbooks to a school district or
- 23 open-enrollment charter school without a delivery charge to the
- 24 school district, open-enrollment charter school, or state, if:
- 25 (i) the publisher or manufacturer does not
- 26 maintain or arrange with a depository in this state under Paragraph
- 27 (A) and the publisher's or manufacturer's textbooks and related

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- 1 products are warehoused or otherwise stored less than 300 miles
- 2 from a border of this state; or
- 3 (ii) the textbooks are <u>open-source</u>
- 4 textbooks, on-line textbooks or on-line textbook components;
- 5 (7) shall, at the time an order for textbooks is
- 6 acknowledged, provide to school districts or open-enrollment
- 7 charter schools an accurate shipping date for textbooks that are
- 8 back-ordered;
- 9 (8) shall guarantee delivery of textbooks at least 10
- 10 business days before the opening day of school of the year for which
- 11 the textbooks are ordered if the textbooks are ordered by a date
- 12 specified in the sales contract; and
- 13 (9) shall submit to the State Board of Education an
- 14 affidavit certifying any textbook the publisher or manufacturer
- 15 offers in this state to be free of factual errors at the time the
- 16 publisher executes the contract required by Section 31.026.
- 17 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
