## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to instructional materials and technological equipment in
  3 public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 31.101, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a), (b), and (c) and adding Subsections (e),
- 7 (f), (g), (h), and (i) to read as follows:
- 8 Section 31.101. SELECTION AND PURCHASE OF TEXTBOOKS BY
- 9 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. (a) Each year, during a period established by
- 10 the State Board of Education, the board of trustees of each school
- 11 district and the governing body of each open-enrollment charter
- 12 school shall:

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- 13 (1) for a subject in the foundation curriculum, notify
- 14 the State Board of Education of the textbooks selected by the board
- 15 of trustees or governing body for the following school year from
- 16 among the textbooks on the appropriate conforming or nonconforming
- 17 list; instructional materials and electronic textbooks identified
- 18 by the commissioner under 31.101(c)(3); or
- 19 (2) for a subject in the enrichment curriculum:
- 20 (A) notify the State Board of Education of each
- 21 textbook selected by the board of trustees or governing body for the
- 22 following school year from among the textbooks on the appropriate
- 23 conforming or nonconforming list; instructional materials and
- 24 electronic textbooks identified by the commissioner under

- 2 (B) notify the State Board of Education that the
- 3 board of trustees or governing body has selected a textbook that is
- 4 not on the conforming or nonconforming list.
- 5 (b) If a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 6 selects a textbook for a particular subject in the foundation or
- 7 enrichment curriculum and grade level that is not on the conforming
- 8 or nonconforming list, the state shall pay to the district or school
- 9 an amount equal to the lesser of:
- 10 (1) 70 percent of the cost to the district of the
- 11 textbook, multiplied by the number of textbooks the district or
- 12 school needs for that subject and grade level; or
- 13 (2) 70 percent of the limitation established under
- 14 Section 31.025 for a textbook for that subject and grade level,
- 15 multiplied by the number of textbooks the district or school needs
- 16 for that subject and grade level.
- 17 (c) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 18 that selects a textbook that is not on the conforming or
- 19 nonconforming list:
- 20 (1) is responsible for the portion of the cost of the
- 21 textbook that is not paid by the state under Subsection (b); and
- 22 (2) may use funds received from the state under
- 23 Subsection (b) [only] for purchasing the textbook for which the
- 24 funds were received, or
- 25 (3) may use funds received from the supplement to the
- 26 allotment under Section 32.005 according to rules adopted by the
- 27 commissioner. The state shall pay to the district or school 100

- 1 percent of the limitation established under Section 31.025 for
- 2 materials for each subject and grade level, multiplied by the
- 3 number of instructional materials and electronic textbooks the
- 4 district or school needs for each subject and grade level.
- 5 (d) For a textbook that is not on the conforming or
- 6 nonconforming list, a school district or open-enrollment charter
- 7 school must use the textbook for the period of the review and
- 8 adoption cycle the State Board of Education has established for the
- 9 subject and grade level for which the textbook is used.
- 10 (e) The commissioner shall adopt a list of instructional
- 11 materials and electronic textbooks that may be purchased by a
- 12 school district and funded under Section 31.101(c)(3).
- 13 Instructional materials and electronic textbooks placed on the
- 14 commissioner's list will be reviewed and recommended by a panel of
- 15 recognized school district experts in content and education
- 16 <u>technology</u>.
- 17 (f) The commissioner shall adopt minimum criteria that
- 18 instructional materials and electronic textbooks must meet to be
- 19 included on the list adopted by the commissioner. The criteria
- 20 <u>must:</u>
- 21 (1) include evidence of alignment with current
- 22 <u>research in the subject area addressed;</u>
- 23 (2) include the coverage of the essential knowledge
- 24 and skills for the subject area and grade level of the instructional
- 25 materials and electronic textbooks. The panel under subsection (e)
- 26 must identify:
- 27 (A) each of the essential knowledge and skills

- 1 for the subject and grade level covered by the instructional
- 2 materials and electronic textbooks; and
- 3 (B) the percentage of the essential knowledge and
- 4 skills for the subject and grade level covered by the instructional
- 5 material and electronic textbooks.
- 6 (3) include training and professional development for
- 7 <u>teachers.</u>
- 8 (g) Funds received from the state by school districts and
- 9 open enrollment charter schools under this section may also be used
- 10 <u>to:</u>
- 11 (1) provide for the purchase by school districts of
- 12 technological equipment needed to provide access to State Board of
- 13 Education-approved textbooks or commissioner-approved
- 14 instructional materials or electronic textbooks.
- (h) Not withstanding any other provision of this section, a
- 16 <u>school district or open-enrollment charter school must purchase, at</u>
- 17 a minimum, a classroom set of State Board of Education-approved
- 18 textbooks for a subject and grade level in the foundation
- 19 curriculum.
- 20 (i) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
- 21 implement subsections (e), (f), (g), and (h) of this section.
- 22 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 23 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 24 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 25 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 26 immediate effect, the Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
