5	ARTICLE PROSECUTION BY ATTORNEY GENERAL OF ETHICS-RELATED
6	OFFENSES
7	SECTION01. Effective January 1, 2014, Chapter 402,
8	Government Code, is amended by adding Subchapter D to read as
9	follows:
LO	SUBCHAPTER D. PUBLIC INTEGRITY UNIT
1	Sec. 402.101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
L2	(1) "Offense" means a prohibited act for which state
L3	law imposes a criminal or civil penalty.
L 4	(2) "Prosecute" means represent the state to impose a
15	criminal or civil penalty.
L6	(3) "Prosecuting attorney" means a district attorney,
L7	criminal district attorney, or county attorney.
18	Sec. 402.102. OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION. For
L9	purposes of this subchapter, the following are offenses against
20	<pre>public administration:</pre>
21	(1) an offense under Title 8, Penal Code, committed by
22	a state officer or a state employee in connection with the powers
23	and duties of the state office or state employment;
24	(2) an offense under Chapter 301, 302, 305, 571, 572,
25	<u>or 2004;</u>
26	(3) an offense under Chapter 573 committed by a state
27	officer in connection with the powers and duties of the state
8.	office; and
29	(4) an offense under Title 15, Election Code,

- 1 <u>committed in connection with:</u>
- 2 (A) a campaign for or the holding of state
- 3 office; or
- 4 (B) an election on a proposed constitutional
- 5 amendment.
- 6 Sec. 402.103. OFFENSES INVOLVING INSURANCE FRAUD. For
- 7 purposes of this subchapter, the following are offenses involving
- 8 <u>insurance fraud:</u>
- 9 (1) an offense under Chapter 35, Penal Code, including
- 10 an offense under that chapter that involves workers' compensation
- 11 insurance under Title 5, Labor Code; or
- 12 (2) a fraudulent insurance act as defined by Section
- 13 701.001, Insurance Code, including an act that involves workers'
- 14 compensation insurance under Title 5, Labor Code.
- Sec. 402.104. OFFENSES INVOLVING MOTOR FUELS TAX. For
- 16 purposes of this subchapter, an offense involving motor fuels tax
- means a felony offense under Section 162.403, Tax Code.
- Sec. 402.105. PUBLIC INTEGRITY UNIT. The public integrity
- 19 unit is in the office of the attorney general.
- 20 Sec. 402.106. INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION BY PUBLIC
- 21 INTEGRITY UNIT. (a) The public integrity unit has the authority to
- 22 <u>investigate whether a person has committed:</u>
- 23 (1) an offense against public administration;
- (2) an offense involving insurance fraud; or
- 25 (3) an offense involving motor fuels tax.
- (b) The public integrity unit may, on request of the
- 27 appropriate prosecuting attorney, assist in the prosecution of or
- 28 prosecute an offense under this section.
- 29 (c) If assisting in a prosecution as provided by Subsection
- 30 (b), the public integrity unit may exercise the powers as necessary
- 31 to accomplish the assistance, and the prosecuting attorney retains

- 1 the authority to represent the state in the district and inferior
- 2 courts in the prosecution of the offense.
- 3 (d) The authority of the public integrity unit to
- 4 investigate an offense under Subsection (a) does not preclude
- 5 another person from conducting any investigation as authorized or
- 6 required under other law.
- 7 Sec. 402.107. COOPERATION OF STATE AGENCIES AND LOCAL LAW
- 8 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. (a) To the extent allowed by law, a state
- 9 agency or local law enforcement agency shall cooperate with the
- 10 public integrity unit by providing information requested by the
- 11 unit as necessary to carry out the purposes of this subchapter.
- 12 (b) Information disclosed under this section is
- 13 confidential and not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552.
- Sec. 402.108. VENUE. Notwithstanding other law, venue for
- 15 prosecution of an offense against public administration, an
- 16 offense involving insurance fraud, or an offense involving motor
- 17 fuels tax is in the county in which the offense is committed.
- 18 SECTION ____.02. Effective January 1, 2014, Sections
- 19 301.027(b) and (c), Government Code, are amended to read as
- 20 follows:
- 21 (b) If the president of the senate or speaker receives a
- 22 report or statement of facts as provided by Subsection (a), the
- 23 president of the senate or speaker shall certify the statement of
- 24 facts to the public integrity unit of the office of the attorney
- 25 general [Travis County district attorney] under the seal of the
- 26 senate or house of representatives, as appropriate. The public
- 27 integrity unit may conduct an investigation on receipt of the
- 28 statement of facts under this subsection.
- 29 (c) If after conducting an investigation under Subsection
- 30 (b) the public integrity unit accepts the statement of facts, the
- 31 unit may provide the results of the investigation to the [The Travis

- 1 County district attorney or other prosecuting attorney of the
- 2 county in which the offense is committed, who shall bring the matter
- 3 before the grand jury for action. If the grand jury returns an
- 4 indictment, the prosecuting [district] attorney shall prosecute
- 5 the indictment or request that the attorney general prosecute the
- 6 indictment.
- 7 SECTION ____.03. Effective January 1, 2014, Section 402.009,
- 8 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 402.009. AUTHORITY TO EMPLOY AND COMMISSION PEACE
- 10 OFFICERS. The attorney general may employ and commission peace
- 11 officers as investigators for:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> the limited purpose of assisting the attorney
- 13 general in carrying out the duties of that office relating to
- 14 prosecution assistance and crime prevention; or
- 15 (2) the purpose of investigating offenses against
- 16 public administration, offenses involving insurance fraud, and
- 17 offenses involving motor fuels tax prosecuted under Subchapter D.
- 18 SECTION ____.04. (a) Not later than March 1, 2014, the
- 19 attorney general shall establish the public integrity unit under
- 20 Subchapter D, Chapter 402, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 21 (b) Subchapter D, Chapter 402, Government Code, as added by
- 22 this Act, applies only to the prosecution of an offense against
- 23 public administration or an offense involving insurance fraud or
- 24 motor fuels tax committed on or after April 1, 2014. For purposes of
- 25 this section, an offense is committed before April 1, 2014, if any
- 26 element of the offense occurs before that date.
- (c) The prosecution of an offense committed before April 1,
- 28 2014, is covered by the law in effect immediately before the
- 29 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 30 effect for that purpose, except that a county attorney, district
- 31 attorney, or criminal district attorney may, on the request of the

- 1 attorney general, permit the public integrity unit established
- 2 under Subchapter D, Chapter 402, Government Code, as added by this
- 3 Act, to assume the prosecution of the offense.
- 4 (d) On January 1, 2014, appropriations made by the 83rd
- 5 Legislature to the Judiciary Section, Comptroller's Department,
- 6 for purposes of the Public Integrity Unit, Travis County, are
- 7 transferred to the office of the attorney general for purposes of
- 8 the Public Integrity Unit under Subchapter D, Chapter 402,
- 9 Government Code, as added by this Act.
