## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the transfer of a certificate of convenience and
3	necessity in certain municipalities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 552, Local Government
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 552.024 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 552.024. TRANSFER OF CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND
8	NECESSITY IN CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES. (a) This section applies to a
9	municipality that:
10	(1) has a population of not more than 2,500;
11	(2) is located in a county that:
12	(A) has a population of 1.7 million or more; and
13	(B) has two municipalities with a population of
14	300,000 or more; and
15	(3) is served by a public utility that:
16	(A) provides service to the entire municipality;
17	and
18	(B) charges rates for 5,000 gallons of water for
19	residential customers that are at least 50 percent higher than the
20	rates charged by a municipally owned utility that serves another
21	part of the county in which the municipality is located.
22	(b) Notwithstanding any other law, on application by a
23	municipality described by Subsection (a), the agency with authority
24	over certificates of convenience and necessity for water and sewer

- 1 service shall transfer a certificate of convenience and necessity
- 2 for water and sewer service from a public utility to the
- 3 municipality for the public utility's service area located in the
- 4 municipality's corporate limits, if the municipality:
- 5 (1) is willing to provide continuous and adequate
- 6 water and sewer service to the area; and
- 7 (2) has instituted a condemnation proceeding under
- 8 Chapter 21, Property Code, to acquire the property of the public
- 9 utility's water and sewer system in the municipality's corporate
- 10 <u>limits.</u>
- 11 <u>(c)</u> The transfer is effective on the date the court in which
- 12 the condemnation proceeding is pending issues an order that:
- (1) transfers the property of the public utility to
- 14 the municipality; and
- 15 (2) requires the municipality to ensure continuous and
- 16 adequate water and sewer service to the citizens of the
- 17 municipality.
- 18 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 19 a condemnation proceeding in which the petition is filed on or after
- 20 September 1, 2011. A condemnation proceeding in which the petition
- 21 is filed before September 1, 2011, is governed by the law in effect
- 22 on the date the petition was filed, and that law is continued in
- 23 effect for that purpose.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
