A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 6 SECTION 1. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by

- 8 and (a-6) to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
- 10 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess

- 12 [$social studies_{r}$] and science. Except as provided by Subsection
- 13 (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection

- 19 (a-5) An assessment instrument adopted or developed under
- Subsection (a) must be designed so that: 20
- 21 (1) if administered to students in grades three

- 25 eight, 85 percent of students will be able to complete the
