6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 28.0025 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 28.0025. REVIEW AND REVISION OF ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE
10	AND SKILLS. (a) The State Board of Education shall:
11	(1) conduct a review of the essential knowledge and
12	skills for the foundation curriculum adopted under Section
13	28.002(a)(1); and
14	(2) revise the essential knowledge and skills for that
15	curriculum to narrow the number and scope of student expectations
16	for each subject and grade level in accordance with this section.
17	(b) The scope of the essential knowledge and skills for each
18	subject and grade level of the foundation curriculum must:
19	(1) be more narrow than the scope of the essential
20	knowledge and skills adopted as of January 1, 2015; and
21	(2) require less time for a demonstration of mastery
22	than required for the essential knowledge and skills adopted as of
23	January 1, 2015.
24	(c) In complying with this section, the State Board of

1 Education shall: 2 (1) ensure that a revision of the essential knowledge 3 and skills for the foundation curriculum does not result in a need for the adoption of new instructional materials; 4 5 (2) consider for each subject and grade level, the 6 time: 7 (A) a teacher would require to provide 8 comprehensive instruction on a particular student expectation; and (B) a typical student would require to master a 9 10 particular student expectation; (3) determine whether, in light of the consideration 11 12 required by Subdivision (2), each essential knowledge and skill of a subject can be comprehensively taught within the shorter of the 13 14 following periods: 15 (A) the number of school days available for instruction before the date a state assessment instrument is 16 17 administered for the subject; or (B) the number of school days required under 18 19 Section 25.081, not including the number of days required for 20 testing; 21 (4) determine whether the college and career readiness 22 standards have been appropriately integrated in the essential 23 knowledge and skills for each subject and grade level; and 24 (5) consider whether an ass<u>essment instrument</u> administered under Section 39.023 adequately assesses a particular 25 26 student expectation.

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27 (d) Not later than September 1, 2018, the State Board of

Section 31.002, Education Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows: 7 8 (1-b) "Proclamation" means a request for production of instructional materials issued by the State Board of Education. 9 10 SECTION 3. Sections 31.0211(a) and (d), Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 11 A school district is entitled to an [annual] allotment 12 (a) each biennium from the state instructional materials fund for each 13 14 student enrolled in the district on a date during the last year of 15 preceding biennium [school year] specified by the the commissioner. The commissioner shall determine the amount of the 16 17 allotment per student each biennium [year] on the basis of the amount of money available in the state instructional materials fund 18 to fund the allotment. An allotment under this section shall be 19 transferred from the state instructional materials fund to the 20 credit of the district's instructional materials account as 21 provided by Section 31.0212. 22

(d) Each <u>biennium</u> [year] a school district shall use the district's allotment under this section to purchase, in the following order:

(1) instructional materials necessary to permit thedistrict to certify that the district has instructional materials

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1 that cover all elements of the essential knowledge and skills of the 2 required curriculum, other than physical education, for each grade 3 level as required by Section 28.002; and

4 (2) any other instructional materials or 5 technological equipment as determined by the district.

6 SECTION 4. Section 31.0212(a), Education Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:

8 (a) The commissioner shall maintain an instructional 9 materials account for each school district. <u>In the first year of</u> 10 <u>each biennium</u> [Each school year], the commissioner shall deposit in 11 the account for each district the amount of the district's 12 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211.

13 SECTION 5. Sections 31.0215(a) and (b), Education Code, are 14 amended to read as follows:

(a) The commissioner shall, as early as practicable during each <u>biennium</u> [fiscal year], notify each school district and open-enrollment charter school of the estimated amount to which the district or charter school will be entitled under Section 31.0211 during the next fiscal <u>biennium</u> [year].

The commissioner may allow a school district 20 (b) or open-enrollment charter school to place an order for instructional 21 materials before the beginning of a fiscal biennium [year] and to 22 23 receive instructional materials before payment. The commissioner 24 shall limit the cost of an order placed under this section to 80 percent of the estimated amount to which a school district or 25 open-enrollment charter school is estimated to be entitled as 26 provided by Subsection (a) and shall first credit any balance in a 27

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1 (b-3) In determining the disbursement of money to the 2 available school fund and the amount of that disbursement that will 3 be used, in accordance with Section 43.001(d), to fund the 4 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211, the board 5 must consider the cost of all instructional materials and 6 technology requirements for that state fiscal biennium.

7 (f) The board shall amend any <u>proclamation</u> [request for 8 production] issued for the purchase of instructional materials to 9 conform to the instructional materials funding levels provided by 10 the General Appropriations Act for the year of implementation <u>and</u> 11 to comply with Subsection (b-1).

SECTION 7. Section 43.001(d), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

(d) Each <u>biennium</u> [year] the State Board of Education shall set aside an amount equal to 50 percent of the [annual] distribution for that <u>biennium</u> [year] from the permanent school fund to the available school fund as provided by Section 5(a), Article VII, Texas Constitution, to be placed, subject to the General Appropriations Act, in the state instructional materials fund established under Section 31.021.

21 SECTION 8. Section 403.093(d), Government Code, is amended 22 to read as follows:

(d) The comptroller shall transfer from the general revenue fund to the foundation school fund an amount of money necessary to fund the foundation school program as provided by Chapter 42, Education Code. The comptroller shall make the transfers in installments as necessary to comply with Section 42.259, Education

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Code, and permit the Texas Education Agency, to the extent 1 authorized by the General Appropriations Act, to make temporary 2 transfers from the foundation school fund for payment of the 3 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211, Education 4 Code. Unless an earlier date is necessary for purposes of temporary 5 6 transfers for payment of the instructional materials allotment, an [An] installment must be made not earlier than two days before the 7 date an installment to school districts is required by Section 8 42.259, Education Code, and must not exceed the amount necessary 9 for that payment and any temporary transfers for payment of the 10 instructional materials allotment. 11 SECTION 9. Sections 31.101(d) and (e), Education Code, are 12 repealed. 13

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
