- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 444.030(b), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The commission shall enter into an agreement as required
- 8 by Subsection (a) with the:
- 9 (1) <u>Texas</u> [<u>Central</u>] Education Agency regarding the
- 10 arts in education program in the public schools; and
- 11 (2) office of the governor [Music, Film, Television,
- 12 and Multimedia Office in the governor's office regarding work with
- 13 the state's music and film industries; and
- 14 [(3) Texas Department of Commerce], Texas Department
- 15 of Transportation, and Parks and Wildlife Department regarding
- 16 state tourism promotion efforts.
- SECTION 2. Section 2155.444(h), Government Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (h) The [Music, Film, Television, and Multimedia Office
- 20 within the] office of the governor has exclusive rulemaking
- 21 authority for purposes of:
- 22 (1) determining whether an advertising campaign is
- 23 subject to the requirements of this section;
- 24 (2) establishing a bid process for purposes of the

- 1 services described by Subsection (f); and
- 2 (3) establishing criteria to determine whether a
- 3 commercial production company or advertising agency is located in
- 4 this state for the purposes of this section.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 2165.008(a)(1), Government Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Office" means the <u>office of the governor</u> [Music,
- 8 Film, Television, and Multimedia Office].
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 504.639(b), Transportation Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (b) After deduction of the department's administrative
- 12 costs, the remainder of the fee for issuance of the license plates
- 13 shall be deposited to the credit of the general revenue fund [Texas
- 14 Music Foundation account established by Section 7.027, Education
- 15 Code].
- 16 SECTION 5. The following statutes are repealed:
- 17 (1) Section 7.027, Education Code;
- 18 (2) Section 403.029, Government Code;
- 19 (3) Chapters 485 and 485A, Government Code; and
- 20 (4) Sections 151.3185 and 151.3415, Tax Code.
- 21 SECTION 6. On the effective date of this Act:
- 22 (1) the Music, Film, Television, and Multimedia Office
- 23 in the office of the governor is abolished;
- 24 (2) all records and other property in the custody of
- 25 the Music, Film, Television, and Multimedia Office are transferred
- 26 to the office of the governor;
- 27 (3) all unobligated and unexpended appropriations of

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- 1 the Music, Film, Television, and Multimedia Office lapse; and
- 2 (4) all donations, gifts, and grants made to the
- 3 Music, Film, Television, and Multimedia Office shall be transferred
- 4 to the office of the governor to be used for purposes consistent
- 5 with the mission of the former Music, Film, Television, and
- 6 Multimedia Office.
- 7 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
