1	AN ACT
2	relating to the use of open educational resources.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 51.451, Education Code, is amended by
5	adding Subdivision (4-a) to read as follows:
6	(4-a) "Open educational resource" means a teaching,
7	learning, or research resource that is in the public domain or has
8	been released under an intellectual property license that permits
9	the free use and repurposing of the resource by any person. The
10	term may include full course curricula, course materials, modules,
11	textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and any other tools,
12	materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge.
13	SECTION 2. Section 51.452 , Education Code, is amended by

- 16 (a) Each institution of higher education shall:
- 17 (1) for each semester or academic term, compile a 18 course schedule indicating each course offered by the institution

amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as

- 19 for the semester or term to postsecondary students;
- 20 (2) with respect to each course, include with the
- 21 schedule a list of the required and recommended textbooks that
- 22 specifies, to the extent practicable, the following information for
- 23 each textbook:

1 (B) the author; 2 (C) the publisher; 3 (D) the most recent copyright date; [and] 4 (E) the International Standard Number 5 assigned, if any; and (F) whether the textbook is an open educational 6 7 resource; 8 (3) except as provided by Subsection (b), at the time required by Subsection (c)(2): 9 (A) publish the textbook list with the course 10 schedule on the institution's Internet website and with any course 11 12 schedule the institution provides in hard copy format to the students of the institution; and 13 14 (B) make that information available to college 15 bookstores and other bookstores that generally serve the students of the institution; and 16 17 (4)except as provided by Subsection (b), as soon as practicable after the information becomes available disseminate as 18 19 required by Subdivision (3) specific information regarding any revisions to the institution's course schedule and textbook list. 20 (d) If an institution of higher education or a college 21 bookstore publishes a textbook list with a course schedule on an 22 Internet website that provides a search function, the institution 23 24 or bookstore must: 25 (1) ensure that the search function permits a search 26 based on whether a course or section of a course requires or

recommends only open educational resources; or

- 2 of courses that require or recommend only open educational
- 3 <u>resources.</u>
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 51.453, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 51.453. TEXTBOOK ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS.
- 7 To the extent practicable, an institution of higher education shall
- 8 make reasonable efforts to disseminate to its students information
- 9 regarding:
- 10 (1) available institutional programs for renting
- 11 textbooks or for purchasing used textbooks;
- 12 (2) available institutional guaranteed textbook
- 13 buyback programs;
- 14 (3) available institutional programs for alternative
- 15 delivery of textbook content; [and]
- 16 (4) the availability of courses and sections of
- 17 courses that require or recommend only open educational resources;
- 18 and
- 19 (5) other available institutional textbook
- 20 cost-savings strategies.
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 51.454(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- 23 (a) When a textbook publisher provides information
- 24 regarding a textbook or supplemental material other than an open
- 25 educational resource to a faculty member or other person in charge
- 26 of selecting course materials at an institution of higher
- 27 education, the publisher shall also provide to the faculty member

- 1 or other person written information that includes:
- 2 (1) the price at which the publisher would make the
- 3 textbook or supplemental material available to a college bookstore
- 4 or other bookstore that generally serves the students of the
- 5 institution and, if applicable, to the public;
- 6 (2) the copyright dates of the current and three
- 7 preceding editions of the textbook;
- 8 (3) a description of any substantial content revisions
- 9 made between the current edition of the textbook or supplemental
- 10 material and the most recent preceding edition of the textbook or
- 11 material, including the addition of new chapters, new material
- 12 covering additional time periods, new themes, or new subject
- 13 matter;
- 14 (4) information as to whether the textbook or
- 15 supplemental material is available in other formats, such as a
- 16 paperback or unbound version; and
- 17 (5) the price at which the publisher would make the
- 18 textbook or supplemental material in any alternative format
- 19 available to a bookstore described by Subdivision (1) and, if
- 20 applicable, to the public.
- 21 SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Section 61.0668 to read as follows:
- 23 <u>Sec. 61.0668. OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES GRANT PROGRAM.</u>
- 24 (a) In this section, "open educational resource" has the meaning
- 25 assigned by Section 51.451.
- 26 (b) The board shall establish and administer a grant program
- 27 to encourage faculty at institutions of higher education to adopt

- 1 and develop courses that use only open educational resources.
- 2 (c) Under the program, a faculty member of an institution of
- 3 higher education may apply to the board for a grant to redesign a
- 4 course at the institution to exclusively use open educational
- 5 resources.
- 6 (d) The board shall select at least three persons qualified
- 7 to review the curriculum of the course that is the subject of the
- 8 application, as determined by the board, to evaluate an application
- 9 for a grant under this section. If the application is rejected, the
- 10 reviewing persons must provide feedback on the application to the
- 11 faculty member. The feedback may be provided anonymously.
- 12 (e) A faculty member who receives a grant under the program
- 13 shall ensure that any open educational resource used in the
- 14 redesigned course is provided to a student enrolled in the course at
- 15 <u>no cost other than the cost of printing.</u>
- (f) A faculty member who receives a grant under the program
- 17 must submit to the board for each of the four semesters immediately
- 18 following the implementation of the redesigned course a report that
- 19 includes:
- 20 (1) the number of students who have completed the
- 21 course;
- 22 (2) an estimate of the amount of money saved by a
- 23 student due to the use of open educational resources in the course;
- 24 (3) a description of the open educational resources
- 25 used in the course;
- 26 (4) the number of other faculty members, if any, who
- 27 adopted the redesigned curriculum of the course; and

- (5) any other information required by the board. 1 2 (g) A faculty member who receives a grant under the program may continue to submit a report described by Subsection (f) for a 3 semester that occurs after the faculty member's duty to submit a 4 report under that subsection has expired. The board may consider a 5 6 faculty member's failure to submit additional reports under this 7 subsection in evaluating a subsequent grant application submitted 8 by the faculty member.
- 9 (h) A faculty member who is no longer employed by an institution of higher education forfeits any grant awarded under the program.
- (i) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
 the board shall submit to the governor, lieutenant governor,
 speaker of the house of representatives, and each standing
 legislative committee with primary jurisdiction over higher
 education a report on:
- 17 (1) the total number of grants distributed under the

program;

- 19 <u>(2) the number of students who completed a course</u> 20 redesigned under the program;
- 21 (3) an estimate of the total amount of money saved by 22 students due to the use of open educational resources in courses 23 redesigned under the program;
- 24 (4) a list of any subject areas that would benefit from 25 the development of open educational resources; and
- 26 <u>(5) recommendations on future steps for developing</u>
 27 open educational resources.

- 1 (j) The board shall adopt rules for the administration of
- 2 the program.
- 3 (k) This section expires September 1, 2021.
- 4 SECTION 6. Subchapter A, Chapter 441, Government Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 441.021 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 441.021. FEASIBILITY STUDY ON STATE REPOSITORY OF OPEN
- 7 EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES. (a) In this section, "open educational
- 8 resource" has the meaning assigned by Section 51.451, Education
- 9 Code.
- 10 (b) The commission shall conduct a study to determine the
- 11 feasibility of creating a state repository of open educational
- 12 resources. The study must consider:
- 13 (1) methods for facilitating public access to open
- 14 educational resources;
- 15 (2) the resources needed to create the repository; and
- 16 (3) any potential challenges in creating the
- 17 repository.
- 18 (c) In conducting the study, the commission shall
- 19 collaborate with relevant state agencies and other stakeholders,
- 20 including the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, the Texas
- 21 Education Agency, and representatives of public institutions of
- 22 higher education and school districts.
- 23 (d) Not later than September 1, 2018, the commission shall
- 24 submit to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house
- 25 of representatives, and each standing legislative committee with
- 26 primary jurisdiction over higher education a report on the results
- 27 of the study and any recommendations for legislative or other

- 1 <u>action. The report must include information on:</u>
- 2 (1) the methods by which open educational resources
- 3 would be gathered and curated;
- 4 (2) measures to ensure public access to the
- 5 repository;
- 6 (3) methods of encouraging the use of the repository;
- 7 (4) management of intellectual property rights; and
- 8 (5) any other measures necessary to ensure the
- 9 repository's success.
- 10 (e) This section expires September 1, 2019.
- 11 SECTION 7. Sections 51.451, 51.452, 51.453, and 51.454,
- 12 Education Code, as amended by this Act, apply beginning with the
- 13 2017-2018 academic year.
- 14 SECTION 8. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 15 of this Act, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 16 adopt rules for the administration of the open educational
- 17 resources grant program under Section 61.0668, Education Code, as
- 18 added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
