Relating to the authority of a justice of the peace to issue a search warrant to collect a blood specimen from a person arrested for certain intoxication criminal offenses.

Relating to repealing civil asset forfeiture provisions and establishing criminal asset forfeiture in this state.

HB 472 Dutton
Relating to the extent of a defendant's criminal responsibility for the conduct of a coconspirator in a capital murder case.

HB 479 Dutton
Relating to asset forfeiture proceedings under the Code of Criminal Procedure.

HB 828 Rose
Relating to credit toward payment of a fine and costs for certain misdemeanants confined in jail or prison before sentencing.

HB 980 Beckley | et al.
Relating to the repeal of the criminal offense of homosexual conduct.

HB 1029 Moody
Relating to the sealing of and discovery procedures relating to certain recordings of children constituting evidence in a criminal case in a criminal hearing or proceeding.

HB 1445 Rosenthal
Relating to prohibiting carrying a firearm while intoxicated; creating an offense.

HB 1498 Metcalf
Relating to the prosecution of the offense of continuous sexual abuse of a young child or children.

HB 1615 Schaefer
Relating to the state's burden of proof in certain asset forfeiture proceedings under the Code of Criminal Procedure.

HB 1811 Murr
Relating to increasing the criminal penalty for certain boating while intoxicated offenses.

HB 2034 VanDeaver
Relating to increasing the criminal punishment for the offense of invasive visual recording.

HB 2361 Moody
Relating to the prosecution of limited liability companies and other business entities under the Penal Code.

HB 2381 Dutton
Relating to the release on bail of a person charged with a violation of parole or mandatory supervision.

HB 2754 White
Relating to the issuance of a citation or notice to appear for certain misdemeanors punishable by fine only and the court's authority to order a defendant confined in jail for failure to pay a fine or cost, for failure to appear, or for contempt.

HB 2896 Collier
Relating to the entry of a plea by defendants charged with certain misdemeanors involving family violence.

HB 3177 Smith
Relating to the prosecution of the offense of continuous sexual abuse of a child or disabled individual.

HB 3281 Hinojosa
Relating to a limitation on the use of a victim's gender identity or sexual orientation as the basis for a defense in the trial of a criminal offense.

HB 3490 Cole
Relating to the prosecution and punishment of the criminal offense of harassment.

HB 3539 Rose
Relating to the appointment of a local public defender's office to represent indigent defendants in criminal cases.

HB 3588 Hunter
Relating to increasing the criminal penalties for the offenses of producing, directing, or promoting a sexual performance by a child and possessing child pornography.

HB 3589 Sanford
Relating to credit toward payment of certain fines, costs, fees, and surcharges imposed on certain offenders before, during, or after a period of confinement for another offense.

HB 3729 Shaheen
Relating to creating the criminal offense of possession of an animal by a person who has been previously convicted of an offense involving animal cruelty.

HB 3824 Sherman, Sr.
Relating to an affirmative finding of family violence entered in the trial of certain offenses.

HB 3938 Moody
Relating to the consideration of the views of a close relative of a deceased victim regarding the imposition of the death penalty in a capital case.

HB 4237 Turner, Chris
Relating to the criminal offense of stalking.

HB 4287 Zedler
Relating to changing the eligibility of persons charged with certain offenses to receive community supervision, including deferred adjudication community supervision.

HB 4323 Reynolds
Relating to the confidentiality of identifying information of certain
child victims.
