 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the extension of a driver's license suspension or
 1-20 disqualification following certain convictions.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 521.343(c), Transportation Code, is
 1-23 amended to read as follows:

1-24 (c) If the license holder is convicted of operating a motor
 1-25 vehicle while the license to operate a motor vehicle is cancelled,
 1-26 disqualified, suspended, revoked, or denied, the period is extended
 1-27 for 90 days [~~the same term as the original suspension or~~
 1-28 ~~disqualification~~], in addition to any penalty assessed under this
 1-29 chapter or Chapter 522.

1-30 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
 1-31 to a determination of suspension or disqualification made by the
 1-32 Department of Public Safety on or after the effective date of this
 1-33 Act. A determination made before the effective date of this Act is
 1-34 governed by the law in effect when the determination was made, and
 1-35 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

1-36 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
