SB 231 King
Relating to temporary emergency energy facilities.

SB 584 West
Relating to the responsibility of consumer reporting agencies to ensure compliance with certain consumer reporting laws.

SB 600 West
Relating to the partition or voluntary sale of real property owned by certain cotenants; amending the Uniform Partition of Heirs' Property Act.

SB 668 Hughes
Relating to the disclosure of information with regard to artificial intelligence.

SB 841 Hughes
Relating to the beneficiaries of trust funds paid or received in connection with an improvement on specific real property.

SB 986 Bettencourt
Relating to procedures under the public information law, including expedited responses and charges for bad faith requests.

SB 1003 Blanco
Relating to the compensation of a distributed renewable generation owner in certain areas outside of ERCOT.

SB 1244 Schwertner
Relating to unclaimed securities and virtual currency that are presumed abandoned.

SB 1625 Johnson
Relating to the reporting of certain security incidents by public water systems to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and the Department of Information Resources.

SB 1960 Schwertner
Relating to digital replication rights in the voice and visual likeness of individuals; providing private causes of action; authorizing a fee.

SB 1963 Creighton
Relating to a financing mechanism allowing electric utilities to obtain recovery of costs associated with a weather-related event or other natural disaster; granting authority to issue bonds.

SB 1964 Parker
Relating to the regulation and use of artificial intelligence systems and the management of data by governmental entities.

SB 2026 Campbell
Relating to the charging of swipe fees on certain electronic payment transaction; authorizing a civil penalty.

SB 2056 Hancock
Relating to unlawful practices relating to credit card transactions; providing a civil penalty.

SB 2368 Campbell | et al.
Relating to affiliation with certain foreign entities of certain persons working or participating in the electricity market; increasing an administrative penalty.
